1. Introduction

Advocacy and information services perform a crucial role in the disability sector by helping people to make informed decisions about their lives and helping them to choose how they wish to engage with their communities.

The NSW Department Human Services Ageing, Disability and Home Care (ADHC) supports advocacy and information organisations to provide free services to people with a disability, their families and carers.

In the development of this directory, our ADHC funded advocacy and information services provided us with their contact details, addresses and a brief description of their services.

1.1 What are Information Services?

Information services seek to facilitate knowledgeable, connected and capable individuals and communities.

Information services, including print disability services, provide accessible information to people with a disability, their families and carers as well as to the broader community. This support provides specific information about access to the community, disability supports and equipment and promotes the development of community awareness. Information services may also provide information in easy-to-read formats, including plain English and community languages, culturally welcoming images, e-text and symbol communication to increase the reach of information.

Funded information services are guided by and required to comply with the <u>NSW Information Program Guidelines (Disability)</u> The guidelines have been informed by extensive consultation processes via discussion papers and direct liaison with the NSW information sector.

1.2 What are Advocacy Services?

Individual advocacy promotes the rights of people with a disability as respected and valued participants in the community with equal opportunity, choice and inclusion.

Advocacy services enable people with a disability to increase the power and control they have over their lives in order to enjoy what they see as a 'good life' for themselves. Services encourage and assist people with a disability to achieve and maintain their rights as citizens and achieve equity of access and participation within their communities.

Funded advocacy services are guided by and required to comply with the <u>NSW Advocacy Program Guidelines (Disability)</u> The guidelines have been informed by extensive consultation processes via discussion papers and direct liaison with the NSW advocacy sector.

Brief Overview:

Motor Neurone Disease Association of NSW is a registered charitable not-for-profit organisation providing support and information to people with all types of motor neurone disease, their families and carers in NSW, ACT and NT.

Motor neurone disease (MND) is the name given to a group of diseases in which the nerve cells - neurones - controlling the muscles that enable us to move, speak, breathe and swallow; undergo degeneration and die. MND is an uncommon, but by no means rare, disorder. It occurs at similar rates in most countries of the world. It is estimated that there are about 1300 people diagnosed with MND in Australia. Slightly more men than women are diagnosed with MND, most commonly in the 50 to 60 year age group. However, MND may be diagnosed in adults at any age.






